Transfer Applicants

A transfer applicant is an individual who has attended another regionally accredited college or university in any capacity after graduating from high school, regardless of whether any credits have been earned.

To be considered for admission, a transfer applicant should have earned a minimum 2.0 cumulative collegiate GPA or a 'C' average in at least two full-time semesters (24 semester credits) or its equivalent from a regionally accredited college(s). Applicants who have earned fewer than 24 transferable college credits are required to submit a final official high school transcript and standardized test scores. The application will be reviewed based on the high school information and grades as well as credit earned while in college.

All applicants for transfer admission must be eligible to return to the last institution attended as a degree candidate. The applicant must submit official transcripts of all previous work whether or not credit was earned and regardless of whether there is a desire to transfer any credit from another institution. An official transcript from each institution attended must be sent directly to the Office of Admissions and Merit Awards. Failure to submit transcripts may constitute sufficient cause for dismissal from the University. If a student's academic record shows attendance at a college or university, but the student does not have an academic transcript from that institution, the student must request an official enrollment verification from that institution to fulfill the transcript requirement.

Credit for work completed at other institutions by Coastal Carolina University students will not be accepted for transfer if the student has previously failed to earn the required grade in an equivalent course at Coastal Carolina University.

Regardless of the point in the student's academic career in which the student enters the University, in order to be eligible to receive a degree from Coastal Carolina University, a student must earn a minimum of 25 percent of the degree program's requirements "in residence" at the University, including 12 credit hours of the student's major courses and six credit hours of minor courses offered by Coastal. Some programs impose higher student residence and/or major requirements.

Students are responsible for their individual academic programs and for meeting the requirements of their major department and the University.

Transfer applicants for admission must submit:

1. Completed Undergraduate Transfer Application;
2. Specified non-refundable application fee;
3. Official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions attended regardless of whether coursework was completed or transferable and including dual-enrolled coursework completed while in high school; (You must also submit a final official transcript for all coursework in progress up until the time of enrollment prior to beginning of classes at the University.)
4. Final high school transcript and official SAT/ACT scores if fewer than 24 transferable credits of college-level work have been earned from a regionally accredited college or university. (Applicants 22 years of age or older are not required to submit SAT or ACT examination scores.)

Priority deadlines to submit transfer applications:

- Fall semester: June 1.
- Spring semester: Dec. 1.
- Maymester and summer semesters: two weeks prior to the beginning of the semester.

Transfer applications received after these deadlines will be accepted only if space is available. Applications submitted after classes have started but before the add/drop period will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis. No applications will be reviewed after the add/drop period for that semester.

Guaranteed Admission

Transfer students who have earned an Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, or Associate in Applied Science from a South Carolina Technical College will be academically guaranteed admission provided that they satisfy the non-academic admissions review portion of the admissions application. Degrees from foreign institutions are not eligible for academic guaranteed admissions.

Core Waiver

A student will be exempt from having to meet Core Curriculum requirements if the student is accepted to the University with an earned Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, Baccalaureate of Arts, or Baccalaureate of Science degree from a regionally accredited college or university in the U.S. Associate in Applied Science degrees are not eligible for the Core Curriculum exemption.

Transfer Credit for South Carolina Associate Degree Recipients

Effective June 1, 2022, South Carolina state Proviso 117.152 guarantees students who have earned an Associate of Arts (AA) or Associate of Science (AS) degree from a public two-year South Carolina institution of higher learning shall receive a minimum of sixty transfer credit hours at a public four-year South Carolina college or university, and shall be given junior status. Student transcripts for AA and AS degree-earners from public two-year institutions of higher learning in South Carolina will be evaluated for course equivalent transfer, and for credits earned through other mechanisms, such as Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, College-Level Examination Program, the Cambridge General Certificate of Education Exam, or other sources. Any credits not awarded through these mechanisms, up to a maximum of 60 credits, will be awarded SCTR XXX credit, if needed. SCTR XXX is elective credit only, and cannot be substituted for any course requirements in any major.

State Transfer Policies

The South Carolina Course Articulation and Transfer System serves as the primary tool and source of information for transfer of academic credit between and among institutions of higher education in the state. The system provides institutions with the software tools needed to update and maintain course articulation and transfer information easily.

Coastal Carolina University has adopted the following policy for determining transfer of academic credits from regionally accredited institutions:

1. A student transferring to Coastal Carolina University will submit all official transcripts to the Office of Admissions and Merit Awards for evaluation.
2. Up to 76 transferable credits of college parallel courses may be accepted from a regionally accredited two-year college transfer program to be applicable toward a Coastal Carolina University degree.
3. Up to 90 transferable credits of college parallel courses may be accepted from regionally accredited four-year colleges or universities to be applicable toward a Coastal Carolina University degree.
4. A maximum of 30 credit hours may be applied toward a bachelor's degree from the combined sources of military credit and correspondence credit.

5. A minimum grade of 'C' (e.g., C-, C, or C+) in a course is required for transfer credit to be awarded for that course. Coursework completed on a pass/fail grading scale will only be considered for credit if the course is academic in nature and the institution's transcript key defines a pass as equivalent to a minimum grade of 'C'.
6. Students cannot receive credit for a course taken at Coastal Carolina University if they have received transfer credit for an equivalent course taken previously at another institution. Transferred courses may be used to satisfy degree requirements subject to program approval. A student can never be awarded more transfer credit for a course than the original institution awarded.
7. Courses taken at another institution while under academic suspension may transfer to Coastal Carolina University in accordance with University transfer policies.
8. Academic coursework taken elsewhere – two-year schools, international credit, non-regionally accredited institutions, Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) – must be handled in the following ways:
 - a. Two-year schools: Certain degree programs do not recognize transfer credit from a two-year institution for courses which are considered upper-division or upper-level (300-400) courses at Coastal Carolina University.
 - b. Applicants who have attended post-secondary educational institutions, colleges, or universities outside the United States are required to submit a professional credential evaluation of all postsecondary work completed including a course-by-course report, GPA calculation, and copies of original transcripts verified by a credential evaluation service by an organization that is recognized by the U.S. Department of Education to conduct foreign credential evaluation and that is a member of NACES or AICE. These reports should be sent directly to International Recruitment and Admissions in the Office of Global Engagement at Coastal Carolina University. Detailed course descriptions from foreign colleges/universities must also be sent in English. Courses are evaluated in consultation with the dean of the college of the student's major and with the dean of each course in review.
 - c. Transfer applicants with advanced standing from colleges and universities not accredited by a regional accrediting association must validate, by examination, all credits presented for transfer. A detailed explanation of validation procedures may be found in the Credit by Examination section of the University catalog or may be obtained from the Registrar (catalog.coastal.edu).
 - d. Business-related transfer credits will be awarded as departmental electives for upper-division or upper-level coursework from a regionally accredited four-year university or college that is not accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB).
9. Repeated coursework, including repeat forgiveness for individual courses or academic forgiveness/bankruptcy, will be evaluated based on the policy of the applicant's prior or home institution.
10. All courses completed at a regionally accredited institution will be evaluated for transfer, regardless of the applicant's academic standing at the applicant's prior or home institution.
11. Coursework with nonstandard grades (withdrawal, withdrawal failing, repeated course, pass, satisfactory, etc.) will be evaluated based on the transcript key and institutional policy of the applicant's prior or home institution.

Transcript Evaluation

The Office of Admissions and Merit Awards will complete an initial evaluation of transcripts to identify courses that can transfer for credit to Coastal Carolina University. In the acceptance packet, accepted students will receive Instructions to access the transfer course summary in their student portal. Refer to the list of approved courses for transfer in this guide.

The department chair or academic advisor evaluates specific courses, as needed, and determines which course credits apply to that particular major.

For additional information on transcript evaluation, call the Office of Admissions and Merit Awards at 843-349-2170. If a student later decides to change their major, a re-evaluation of applicable credits must be completed by the department chair of the new major.

As a general rule, credits earned in courses that apply to one or more of the following categories are usually not acceptable for transfer credit:

- Courses that are occupational or technical in nature.
- Courses that are essentially remedial.
- Courses not recognized in that institution's catalog as part of its college parallel transfer program.

Exceptions to the above categories may be made only by the dean or designee of the college in which the student plans to enroll (major), or by the dean or designee of the college that offers the course. Certain degree programs do not recognize some transfer credits from two-year institutions for courses that are considered upper-division or upper-level courses at Coastal Carolina University. However, some degree programs will grant transfer credit for such courses as lower-level electives or Core Curriculum requirements. **Each transfer student should discuss the transfer of academic credits not listed in this guide with their academic advisor.** Students should be aware that changing majors while at Coastal Carolina University will require a re-evaluation and approval of the transfer credits for application to the new majors.

Calculation of Coastal Carolina University Grade Point Average

Coastal Carolina University accepts the credit only for transfer, not the *grade* for grade point average (GPA) calculation. A student's GPA is calculated on Coastal Carolina University courses only. The GPA is calculated on the basis of all work in the student's career **at Coastal Carolina University**. All credits earned at other institutions and transferred to Coastal Carolina University may be used to satisfy program requirements but will not be calculated as a part of the GPA.

Admissions Requirements

Wall College of Business Administration

A student begins in the Wall College of Business as a pre-major. To be fully admitted and eligible to take 300- and 400-level classes, the student must fulfill the requirements listed below:

1. Have a minimum cumulative collegiate GPA of 2.25 after 45 earned credit hours.
2. Have a grade of 'C' or better in the following courses: CBAD 120, ENGL 101, CBAD 201, ECON 201 or ECON 202, and one of the following CSCI 110, CSCI 120, CSCI 135, DCD 102, DCD 201, or GEOG 204. For accounting, finance, and economics majors, a grade of 'C' or better is required in MATH 132 or MATH 160. For management, marketing, and hospitality majors, a grade of 'C' or better is required in one of the following: MATH 138, MATH 132, or MATH 160.
3. Complete a formal application for admission into the Wall College of Business and submit it to their academic advisor. **Incoming transfer students with more than 45 credit hours will be automatically evaluated for admission into the Wall College of Business.**

Transfer credit for 300- or 400-level business courses will be accepted, for degree requirements, only from AACSB accredited business programs. Exceptions to this policy must be approved through the dean's office with consultation, as appropriate, with department heads. Transfer students will be required to take, at CCU, a minimum of 24 credit hours of 300- and 400-level courses from the Wall College of Business foundation, core, and major requirements. The 24 credit hours must include CBAD 478.

Spadoni College of Education and Social Sciences

An education major begins in the Spadoni College of Education and Social Sciences as a pre-major. During the first two years of study (approximately 60 semester credit hours) students will be advised by their professional adviser and must complete the prescribed introductory courses for their respective programs which will include but not be limited to: EDUC 111; EDUC 204; EDUC 215; ENGL 101, ENGL 102, and the majority of their Core Curriculum coursework in addition to specific major requirements. In addition, all pre-professional program education majors will be required to take and pass the PRAXIS I exam or qualify for exemption and at the conclusion of 60 hours of instruction, apply for admission to the Professional Program in Teacher Education. *This information may change without notice.*

Marine Science

Prior to being admitted to the Department of Marine Science as a degree candidate, a transfer student must meet the general admissions requirements and complete one of the following:

1. A score of 510 or higher on the SAT math sub-test for SAT exams taken in March 2016 and later, or a math sub test minimum score of 470 or higher on SAT exams taken prior to March 2016, or a score of 20 or higher on the math sub test of the ACT exam. Students may retake the SAT or ACT and submit new scores for consideration.
OR
2. Completion of College algebra or a higher-level college math course with a grade of at least 'C' from a regionally accredited college or university.

Students who meet general admissions requirements, but do not satisfy requirements for admission as a degree-seeking marine science major will be admitted as a pre-marine science major. A student classified as a pre-marine science major is not eligible to receive an Academic Common Market tuition waiver at Coastal Carolina University. Only students who are fully admitted into the major are eligible to apply for consideration of this designation.

Music (B.A.) and Theatre Arts (B.F.A.)

Transfer students must meet the general admissions requirements and audition for full admittance to these majors. For more information on auditions, see coastal.edu/music/audition or coastal.edu/theatre/audition.

PGA Golf Management Program

To be admitted to the PGA Golf Management program, a transfer student must meet the general admissions requirements of the University, choose a major within the Wall College of Business Administration and submit the following documentation to CCU's PGA Golf Management program:

- Application to the PGA Golf program.
- Verification of a handicap of 12 or less.
- Letter of Recommendation from a PGA member.

Health Administration, B.S. (Completion Program)

To be admitted to the major, transfer students must meet the general admissions requirements and:

- Have an associate degree from a regionally accredited institution and a certification or license in a health science area,
OR
- Have earned an Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, Bachelor of Arts, or Bachelor of Science degree from a regionally accredited institution.
OR
- Have earned 40 credit hours from a regionally accredited institution.

Nursing (R.N. to B.S.N. Completion Program), B.S.N.

Nursing (R.N. to B.S.N. Completion Program), B.S.N. To be admitted to the major, transfer students must meet the general admissions requirements, and must have graduated from an accredited nursing program with a grade of 'C' or better in all nursing courses, and have an active license as a registered nurse (RN) in South Carolina or live in a Nurse Licensure Compact (NLC) state with multi-state privileges, or be eligible to test. See ncsbn.org for a list of NLC states.

Nursing, BSN

Prior to being admitted as a degree candidate, a transfer student must meet the general admissions requirements and have one of the following:

- Have a score of 1100 or higher on the SAT exam (for test dates of March 2016 and later), *OR*
- A score of 22 or higher on the ACT exam, *OR*
- Earned a TEAS-V score of 78% or higher

Acceptance into pre-nursing does not guarantee progression. Students who meet general admissions requirements, but do not satisfy requirements for admission as a degree-seeking nursing major will be admitted as a health sciences major.

Professional Studies

To be eligible for entry into the professional studies degree, a student must satisfy one of the following requirements: be 25 years of age, hold an associate degree, or have 45 previous college credits.

Core Curriculum

The purpose of the Core Curriculum is to provide an educational experience in the liberal arts tradition that promotes inquiry, creativity, and critical thinking. The Core Curriculum provides opportunities for students to develop skills in the following: critical thinking and reasoning, written and oral communication, and quantitative and information literacy. The Core Curriculum provides opportunities for students to apply the above-mentioned skills in the practice of the natural sciences, the social sciences, the humanities, and the arts in the context of global and diverse cultural perspectives.

Critical Reading, Writing, and Information Literacy (8 credit hours)

Take both courses:

ENGL 101 (4) and ENGL 102 (4)

Transfer students may satisfy this requirement with six to eight hours of transferable credit for ENGL 101 or ENGL 102.

Communication Across Cultures (3-6 credit hours)

1. Six credit hours in world language at the 110/120 level.

Courses with an LIS prefix are not eligible.

Student must complete the six credits in the same language.

2. Five credit hours in a world language at the 115 level.

Courses with an LIS prefix are not eligible.

3. After taking placement exam:

- After taking the placement exam and placing at or above the 120 level, students must complete with a C or better any three-credit world language course at or above the 120 level.

4. For students transferring credit from another institution of higher education – Either of the following:

- Six transferrable credit hours of a world language 100-level courses in sequence from previous institutions or three hours at the 210 level or above.
- Three to four transferrable credit hours of a world language at the 110 level from a previous institution AND:
 - * One hundred twenty level in the same language at CCU; OR
 - * If 120 level of that language is not available at CCU, then any one (1) course with the LIS prefix.
