DUAL ADMISSIONS AND CORE-TO-CORE TRANSFER AGREEMENT
between
DELAWARE COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE and ALBRIGHT COLLEGE

Preface

Delaware County Community College (DCCC) and Albright College enter into this Dual Admissions and Core-to-Core Transfer Agreement to facilitate the transfer of DCCC students to Albright College's Day and Accelerated Bachelor's Degree Programs.

ALBRIGHT COLLEGE'S TRADITIONAL PROGRAM

Under the Dual Admissions Agreement, DCCC graduates will be guaranteed admission into a traditional day undergraduate bachelor's degree program with junior status at Albright College on the condition that they:

- graduate from DCCC with an Associate in Arts (A.A.), an Associate in Science (A.S.) or an Associate in Fine Art (A.F.A.);
- maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 from DCCC;
- complete a "Dual Admissions Intent" form before final semester begins (Appendix A);
- are in good academic and social standing;
- and satisfy all other Albright College transfer admission requirements.

A full-time student admitted with junior status to Albright College can complete a bachelor's degree in a parallel program at Albright College within four regular semesters provided that the student completes the appropriate associate degree program at DCCC and completes his/her remaining course work on a full-time basis at Albright College. Students are required to complete at least 16 courses at Albright in order to receive their Bachelor's degree from Albright. This Dual Admissions agreement is designed to provide a seamless transfer. In order to achieve this end, students are responsible:

- to receive early advising from both DCCC transfer advisors and Albright advisors about their intended program of study;
- to not change their program of study, as committed to in the "Dual Admissions Letter of Intent";
- to successfully complete all courses within their program of study.

Core-to-Core Component:

Albright College agrees to accept the general education embedded in DCCC's Associate in Arts (A.A.), Associate in Science (A.S.), and Associate in Fine Art (A.F.A.) as meeting all general studies requirements for graduation from Albright, except the foreign language requirement (native speakers exempt), synthesis requirement and English 102 requirement (if students have not completed DCCC's ENG 112 English Composition II: Writing About Literature).

As additional benefit, all Dual Admissions students can take one Albright College day-course per year with tuition waived while enrolled as a DCCC student (maximum of three courses lifetime).

To facilitate the transfer of DCCC graduates to Albright College in accordance with the foregoing guarantee, the parties agree to the following:

Obligations of Albright College:

1. To attend transfer and partner events at DCCC as needed. Albright College will provide DCCC with "Dual Admissions Intent" forms and fact sheets to distribute upon request. (The information is also on the Albright website: www.albright.edu.)
2. To invite DCCC students who have completed a "Dual Admissions Intent" form to an

informational/advising meeting with Albright College faculty and staff on a regular basis at both DCCC and Albright College, in order to facilitate smooth curricular and co-curricular integration to Albright College.

3. To send an Albright College letter of admission to all DCCC students who complete a "Dual Admissions Intent" form and meet the conditions. To receive pre-registration priority in course selection, students must confirm their intention to matriculate at Albright College by June 1 for the fall semester, and by November 15 for the spring semester, and satisfy all other Albright College transfer admission requirements. Late registration can occur until classes begin, if space is available. DCCC students who complete a "Dual Admissions Intent" form will be governed by the Albright College degree requirements in effect at the time of matriculation.
4. To waive the application fee for students who apply to Albright College pursuant to this Agreement.
5. To waive the TOEFL requirement for international students who have obtained an Associate in Arts (A.A.), Associate in Science (A.S.), or Associate in Fine Art (A.F.A.) from DCCC.
6. To award academic scholarships to all qualified graduates admitted to Albright College pursuant to this Agreement. Full-time Albright College students (enrolled in 3 or more courses a semester) with a final DCCC grade point average (GPA) could receive a scholarship of:
 - Founders Scholarship in the amount of \$32,000 with GPA of 3.8 or higher
 - Presidential Scholarship in the amounts of \$25,000 - \$28,000 with a GPA of 3.0 – 3.7
 - Albright Scholarship in the amounts of \$14,000 – \$24,000 with a GPA of 2.4 – 2.9
 - Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship in the amounts of \$28,000 or \$32,000 with a 3.5 or higher – scholarship determination will be made at Albright. For details, please contact the Albright admissions office.
7. All DCCC students who receive a Founders Scholarship or Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship are automatically invited to become members of the Honors Program.
8. To provide information about and to offer full consideration to DCCC students admitted under this Agreement all Albright College, State and Federal financial aid, under the same rules as all other Albright students.
9. To provide transfer credit for all courses for which a quality grade (A, B, C) inclusive of C- was earned for the students' associate degree. Eligible DCCC graduates enrolling at Albright College will be identified upon admission to Albright College and the general education requirements earned prior to transfer will be noted on all pertinent Albright College student records.
10. To provide course equivalency and program transferability information upon request from the Transfer Office at DCCC.

DCCC graduates entering Albright College under the terms of this Agreement must meet all applicable Albright College requirements and deadlines pertaining to registration and payment of tuition and fees. They will abide by the policies and procedures, and any revisions thereof, which apply to all Albright College students.

To ensure DCCC's Dual Admissions students who matriculate at Albright College will have all of the rights and privileges of other Albright College students.

Obligations of Delaware County Community College:

1. Publicize this Agreement to prospective and current DCCC students in its promotional literature.

2. Make special arrangements for Albright College recruiters and advisors to visit DCCC and meet with prospective and current Dual Admissions students.
3. Provide contact information regarding recent associate degree graduates.

Joint Obligations:

1. Each institution will designate a representative or representatives who will coordinate the Dual Admissions and Core-to-Core Transfer Agreement between the two institutions. These representatives will exchange data and documents annually that will contribute to the maintenance and improvement of this Agreement, enhance the transfer process, and promote effective cooperation between institutions. Each institution will consult through appropriate channels prior to implementing major changes in policy or curricula that directly affect students transferring under the terms of this Agreement, and keep each other informed of any other changes of policy or curricula that affect those students. Both Albright College and DCCC will review this Agreement annually and make any changes upon mutual agreement, as needed. Such changes will become effective when both DCCC and Albright College sign the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).
2. DCCC's assigned articulation representative will work with Albright's representative on program-to-program articulation agreements that specify for DCCC transfer students the DCCC courses that satisfy major requirements required for degree completion at Albright College. These representatives will facilitate and support consultation and collaboration between their faculties related to this Agreement, general education, degree requirements, and other academic matters.
3. DCCC and Albright College faculty and staff advisors will provide students with information about this Agreement, Albright College's academic requirements, and the transfer process to Albright College.
4. DCCC and Albright College jointly agree to develop and implement advertising and promotional efforts to communicate the benefits of the Dual Admissions and Core-to-Core transfer agreement.

ALBRIGHT COLLEGE'S ACCELERATED DEGREE PROGRAMS CORE-TO-CORE TRANSFER

Delaware County Community College (DCCC) and Albright College agree to enter into a partnership for the purpose of providing students the opportunity to complete coursework towards an accelerated bachelor's degree in one of the following: Accounting, Business Administration, Computer Information Systems, Computer Information Systems & Management, Crime and Justice, Digital Communications, Organizational Behavior/Applied Psychology or others as developed. This agreement will provide a seamless/integrated approach that will apply all coursework taken as part of an Associate in Art (A.A.), Associate in Science (A.S.) and Associate in Fine Art (A.F.A.) program at Delaware Community College toward the Accelerated Degree Program at Albright College.

Principles of Agreement

1. Albright College agrees to offer the Accelerated Degree Program in the following disciplines at the upper division level: Accounting, Business Administration, Computer Information Systems, Computer Information Systems & Management, Crime and Justice, Digital Communications, Organizational Behavior/Applied Psychology and others as developed.
2. Graduates of DCCC's Associate in Art (A.A.), Associate in Science (A.S.), and Associate in Fine Art (A.F.A.) will be admitted to the Accelerated Degree Program with Core-to-Core transfer benefits as outlined on page one of this agreement, enabling the student to transfer up to 78 total credits towards a bachelor's degree. A.F.A. students will need to complete ENG 112 at DCCC or the equivalent at Albright. Albright College reserves the right to review and approve all applicants for admission into the Accelerated Degree Program. Along with Core-to-Core transfer benefits, Associate in Art (A.A.),

Associate of Science (A.S.), and Associate in Fine Art (A.F.A.) degree recipients will be eligible for a \$2,800 total scholarship distributed across four semesters (\$700 per semester). For Associate in Art (A.A.), Associate in Science (A.S.), and Associate in Fine Art (A.F.A.) degree recipients who have a cumulative grade point average of 3.7 of higher or DCCC alumni who are members of Phi Theta Kappa, the scholarship amount will increase to \$3,500 total distributed across four semesters (\$875 per semester). This scholarship is prorated, so a student must have the associate degree prior to enrolling at Albright College to obtain the full scholarship.

3. Graduates of DCCC's Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) will be admitted to the Accelerated Degree Program. Albright College reserves the right to review and approve all applicants for admission into the Accelerated Degree Program. The amount of transfer credits will vary by program. Interested DCCC students can schedule a meeting with an Albright College Enrollment Advisor to determine total credit transfer. DCCC graduates who have obtained an Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) will be eligible for a \$2,800 total scholarship distributed across four semesters (\$700 per semester). For Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree recipients who have a cumulative grade point average of 3.7 of higher or DCCC alumni who are members of Phi Theta Kappa, the scholarship amount will increase to \$3,500 total distributed across four semesters (\$875 per semester). This scholarship is prorated, so a student must have the associate degree prior to enrolling at Albright College to obtain the full scholarship. Students will be permitted to transfer up to 48 approved elective credits towards an Albright College degree in the Accelerated Degree Program, along with another potential 30 credits in general education, which should benefit the A.A.S. transfer student.
4. Admission, advising, registration and required coursework materials of prospective and enrolled students in the Accelerated Degree Program will be the responsibility of Albright College.
5. DCCC agrees to assist Albright College in marketing the Accelerated Degree Program, specifically our onsite partnership with Delaware County Community College. Albright College will attend transfer and partner programs at DCCC. Albright College will provide DCCC with marketing materials for its Accelerated Degree Program.
6. Each student entering Albright College's Accelerated Degree Program is assured the opportunity to complete all coursework towards the Bachelor's Degree in Accounting, Business Administration, Crime and Justice, Digital Communications, Computer Information Systems, Computer Information Systems & Management, Organizational Behavior/Applied Psychology or other programs as developed.
7. Students participating in this agreement cannot attend another college or university between the time of graduating from DCCC and entering Albright College.

Revision, Renewal and Termination of this Agreement

The Albright College offices of Academic Affairs and Enrollment Management and the appropriate offices at DCCC are responsible for identifying, and communicating to each other, changes in the policies or requirements of their respective institutions that affect this Agreement.

This revised Agreement will be in effect as of the date of its signing, and supersedes the original agreement from September 2002. It will be reviewed annually by the appropriate representatives at each institution, and will be renewed automatically until formally terminated. Either institution may terminate this Agreement at any time by written notice at least one year in advance of the effective date of termination. Should this Agreement be terminated, it is understood that the termination will not apply to students already accepted or enrolled at Albright College under the terms of this Agreement.

The willingness of both institutions to enter this Agreement in order to facilitate the transfer of students from Delaware County Community College into Albright College, and to expand their opportunities for academic success there, is indicated by the signatures shown below. This revised and renewed Dual Admissions and Core-to-Core Transfer Agreement becomes effective upon the signing of this agreement.
